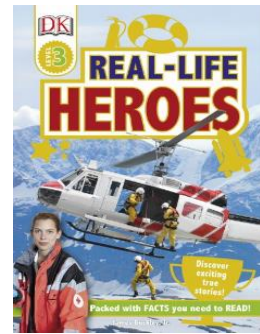
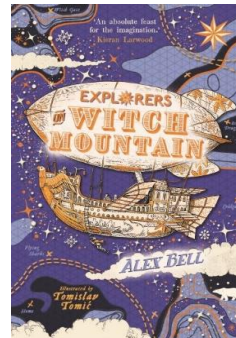
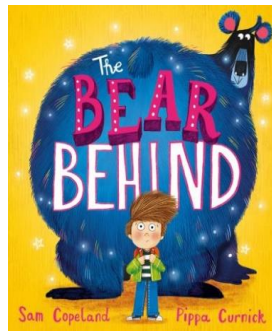
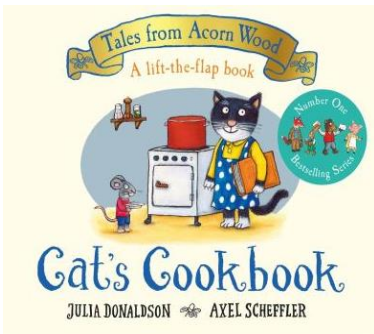
**REMEMBER you can enjoy books by reading on your own, being read to or listening to audio-books.**
