### READING

In school, we recognise that reading, and a person's reading proficiency, is one of the biggest predictors of educational success. Reading is a vital skill across the curriculum so, understandably, it is a top priority in school. As part of our journey of continuous improvement with reading, we have introduced Accelerated Reader for years 2,3 and 4. This is an educational program designed to monitor and manage students' independent reading practice and comprehension. The program assesses students' performance through quizzes and tests based on the books the children have read. As the students read and take quiz-



zes, they are awarded points. If your child is in year 2-4 they should have an accelerated reader book and as soon as they've finished it they can access a quiz for the book online. Any concerns about the safety and wellbeing of children should be directed to Mr Roberts.






